WHO CAN I TALK TO IF I AM WORRIED?



If you are really worried or upset about anything, you can always talk to

either to Mrs Morgan, Mrs. Burns, Mrs McCann or Mrs Hanna (Nursery) they are our designated teachers. All of our teachers care for us but they are specially trained to listen and help.

WHERE DO I GO AT THE END OF THE DAY?

If you are in P1 or P2:

You will leave from your own classroom. You will have to wait with your teacher until an adult comes to collect you. Some children will stay with Miss Brannigan and Mrs Tumility in ASC/EASC.

If you are in P3- P7:

You will be walked to the hall by your teacher. After our final prayer of the day you will wait with the teacher on duty, at the bottom of the ramp until you are collected by an adult. You will only be allowed to walk on your own if you have written permission from an adult.

Bus Children:

Children going home by bus are collected from hall by their designated classroom assistant. She will walk you to your bus and check that you are seated safely before the bus leaves the premises.

Designated Teachers

<u>Prefects</u>

There are P7 prefects. They were elected fairly by the p7 pupils at the start of the school year. You will recognise them by their badges.

The School Council

The school council is made up of x3 pupils from every class from P3 upwards. They meet every month to discuss the day to day running of the school, from the pupils' point of view. If you have any suggestions on how to make the school a better place, just tell your class representative. The councillors can be recognised by their badges.

Buddies

They are special people who can play with you at break time in your playground. They are the "buddies" and you will know them by their hi-viz bibs.

WHAT UNIFORM WILL I WEAR?

Uniforms – Primary School

I Navy blue trousers (boys) /skirts

[] Light blue shirt

- Navy blue tie
- Black Shoes
- I Jumper (Navy) with school crest

[] (Optional) reversible (windproof/fleece) crested coat from Robin Fields (Banbridge)

Optional warm weather uniform (Primary) (Sept & Oct and from Easter to June only)

Boys: navy trouser shorts, light blue short sleeve shirt, tie & school jumper;

Girls: light blue checked dress & school jumper.

For school photos, trips and special occasions, the full school uniform (shirt, tie, trousers/skirt/pinafore) must be worn.

Blue polo shirts are not part of the school uniform and should not be worn to school.



REWARD SYSTEMS

<u>Coins</u>

Every child in St. Colman's Primary School can earn coins for their house at any time for good behaviour, having a sensible attitude, producing quality work, giving lots of effort and much more. At the end of a half-term we tally up the coins and the House with the most wins a prize.

Each class may also have their own individual reward system that your parents will find out about during the curriculum meeting at the beginning of Term 1.

Workers of the Week

Every Friday one child from each class is awarded a sticker and a prize at assembly. Your teacher will chose a pupil who has worked really hard that week



In **Religious Education** we learn about the Catholic faith by reading stories from our Grow in Love Books, and singing songs and hymns. We have assembly every day. In P3 we make our First Confession, in P4 we make our First Communion and in P7 we receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. We welcome children of all faith backgrounds into our school.

In **P.D.M.U**. we learn about ourselves and other people; how to keep healthy, safe and happy. We talk about things like drugs and bullying. We are aiming to become a UNICEF Rights Respecting School.

We study **The Arts**. We learn new songs to sing, and sometimes play musical instruments. Pupils can volunteer in the school choir and compete in drama/theatrical competitions.

The P1-P4 classes are performing in a Nativity Play this year and our P5-7 children are performing in a Carol Service.

We try and copy pictures by famous artists or experiment with paint, pencil, pastel and crayons. Sometimes we make things out of materials such as clay, plasticine, cardboard or Mod Roc.

In **P.E.**, we learn Fundamental Movement Skills. We have a fully equipped school gym and a state of the art Multi Use Games Areas (MUGA) for outdoor games. We use the Banbridge Pool for swimming lessons in KS2. P.E. keeps us fit and healthy, and is also a lot of fun. Our Mile A Day running is a big hit!

WHAT LESSONS WILL I DO?

We do **Numeracy** everyday. We learn multiplication, division, addition and subtraction. We learn aspects of Number, Shape and Space, Measures, Data Handling and Financial Capabilities.

We do **Literacy** everyday. We learn how to use words and punctuation properly, and how to construct sentences. We learn about the different genres of writing. We follow literacy tasks every day and take part in shared/guided reading. We enjoy speaking and listening and use linguistic Phonics to help us read and spell.

In the **World Around Us** we learn how to carry out experiments, and to predict their results. We like to find out how things happen and why. We learn about different countries and cultures in the world, and facts about the Earth and our Solar System We use atlases, reference books, the Internet and videos to help us learn. We learn about other civilisations such as Ancient Egypt, . We also learn about important past events and famous people.

In I.C.T. we explore the 5 E's: Explore, Express, Exchange, Evaluate and Exhibit. We do this through researching topics through the internet, presenting our ideas in different ways, communicating by email and discussion forums, editing and improving our work and saving it on the system. All classrooms have an interactive whiteboard so we can use our computer skills in all of our lessons. We have a set of ipads and at least one computer in every room.
