## Nursery and Primary 1 Admissions - September 2019

The EA have moved to an **online admissions system** for those families seeking to apply for a place in the Nursery and Primary School for September 2019.

The dates window has also changed and no longer opens before the Christmas holidays. The Education Authority (EA) plans to introduce a new portal for parents to apply online. This replaces the current paper-based application form.

The Go Live date for the new digital admissions is Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2019 at 1000. The closing time and date for punctual applications will be on midnight on Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> January 2019. For admission to the forthcoming academic year, parents will **STILL** have to provide their child's birth certificate and/or additional supporting evidence to the school office.

Mr O'Neill will be hosting an **information evening** on the process for both NU/P1 on **Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> December at 1900**. All are welcome.

We are delighted to receive a letter from the Department of Education telling us that our minor works application from Dec 2017 has been approved and that the top field can be converted into a fit for purpose playground.

This is something that the school, the PA, the parish and the community have lobbied hard for over a long period of time. To take delivery of the letter, on the exact same day that our children told us in their survey that the thing they most wanted to improve in our school was the lack of play space, was perfect timing and incredibly well received by our children.

At present I do not have the dates or timeframe for construction - but it is hoped that the new playground, together with the markings on the existing playground will be ready early in the new year.

The work will lead to some minor disruption for our children arriving to school each morning, as it is *likely* that the hill will be out of bounds. Once a risk assessment has been undertaken, all patrons will be informed about the temporary arrangements.
